## ***Seeing is Believing: A Clinician's Guide to the Retina***

**Welcome: Professor Quintin McKellar, Principal, Royal Veterinary College, University of London**

**Presentation: Peter Bedford, Emeritus Professor of Ophthalmology, Royal Veterinary College, University of London**

RVC Principal, Quintin McKellar will give an overview of the Royal Veterinary College and the role it plays in educating and supporting the veterinary profession through its teaching programmes, referral hospitals, diagnostic services and continuing professional development courses.

Peter Bedford will update the audience on his particular area of expertise; Ophthalmology.

He will focus on recognition of ophthalmoscope features in companion animals and other species, including sheep, and the ability to relate features to diagnosis. Peter will provide examples of cases dealt with at the Royal Veterinary College, using colour images of lesions and their interpretation and will provide relevant new information based on recent research.

The audience will learn:

- About latest developments in Ophthalmology
- The ability to recognise the abnormal and differentiate from normal variation
- To understand the meaning of lesions in terms of diagnosis of disease
